









# Restoration Sites

- Site of transplanted vegetation across or along a social trail (Hockett et al., 2017)
  - Ecological appeal, “critical revegetation site”
- High risk, high reward
  - Resource intensive
  - Stubborn visitors must either circumvent or trample
- Goal is for plants to take hold and reclaim trail
  - Vital for healing old, unused social trail scars















# Trail Mitigation

- Disguising the beginning of a trail reduces “releaser cue” (Gramann & Vander Stoep, 1987)
  - Renaturalize with local materials
- Most successful site management technique – off-trail travel reduced to 2% of observed (Hockett et al., 2017)
- Integrates restoration site ideals
- Stubborn visitors can travel through, not around
