THE SONORAN DESERT IS NOT FIRE ADAPTED

Native vegetation is naturally sparse and will not carry fire across the desert. Thus, native plants are not equipped to endure wildfires nor regenerate after burning. Before invasive plants began carpeting our landscape, devastating wildfires were rare. Now, wildfires are rapidly destroying our iconic Sonoran Desert.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

Wildfires in the Sonoran Desert threaten the health and safety of human beings and wildlife, devastate biodiversity, damage infrastructure and destroy our native landscape. Can you imagine our desert without its dazzling spring wildflowers and towering mighty saguaros? We need your help! The time to act is now.

PLANT DESERT FRIENDLY

Non-native plants provide fuel for wildfire expansion, as they grow more carpet-like across the desert soil. Decrease wildfire risk by planting natives, which can grow in patches leaving stretches of bare soil for natural fire suppression.
